
RACIAL EQUITY



What is the Public Art Program?

In 1969, the City and County of San Francisco was one of the first municipalities in the country to enact an Art Enrichment Ordinance.

The Art Enrichment
Ordinance ensures that 2% of the gross construction cost of civic buildings, transportation improvement projects, new parks, and other above-ground structures such as bridges, be allocated for public art.

- Human connection in civic space
- Emotional, intellectual, or spiritual connection with the viewer.
- Unique sense of identity and place

- To promote a diverse and stimulating cultural environment
- To commission work that is sitespecific and meaningful to the community

Division of Training Public Art Project Goals

- Connect viewers to the facility's functions and reflect the mission of the Fire Department, its history, and commitment to service
- Help integrate the facility into the neighborhood with meaningful connections to the community
- Durable and maintainable materials, suitable for an exterior location along a publicly accessible, pedestrian rightof-way (public sidewalk)
- Placement preserves pedestrian access and sightlines into the facility


Division of Training Public Art Opportunity


Cohesive, integrated design that includes two components:


- a sculpture or grouping of sculptures located in the project's mid-block focus area along Carroll Avenue
- approximately 120 linear feet of sculptural or two-dimensional artwork integrated into wall niches within the concrete bioretention planter walls fronting the facility.

- For each new public art project, the SFAC Project Manager in consultation with the Program Director shall develop a Public Art Project Plan.
- The plan identifies the art opportunities, project scope, budget, selection process, level of community involvement and timeline.
- Approval of the Public Art Project
 Plan by the Client Agency and Arts
 Commission authorizes staff to
 proceed with implementing the plan.

- RFQ is open from June 16 September 1, 2025.
 Applications will not be accepted after the September 1, 5:00 p.m. PST deadline.
- All professional, practicing artists living in the United States are eligible to apply for City public art commissions.





How to Apply

- Applications are available through SlideRoom, an online application system for calls for entry. There is no charge to artists for using SlideRoom.
- Application materials include:
 - 1. Letter of Interest
 - 2. Resume
 - 3. Ten images of previous work
 - 4. Image Descriptions



✓ Letter of Interest

- Brief bio that describes your artistic practice and career highlights.
- Skills and experience that are relevant to the needs of this project
- Experience engaging and working with multiple, diverse stakeholders in the development and implementation of artwork.
- If collaborating with another artist, describe the reason for this collaboration.

✓ Resume

Copied and pasted in area provided. Formatting will not be retained.

✓ Ten Images of Previous Work

- SlideRoom accepts all image file types up to 5MB. Images should at least 72 dpi and no larger than 1280 x 1280 pixels
- For team application, please indicate the lead artist for each project

✓ Image Descriptions

• Include the title, medium, dimensions, and year for each work. You may also include a brief statement (2 sentences maximum) about each work.

Artist Qualification Panel

- Artist Qualification Panel reviews all RFQ applicants to develop a short list of applicants deemed most qualified for the project opportunities.
- The qualified list is submitted for further review to the Artist Review Panel.
- The reviewers who served on the Qualification Panel (other than SFAC staff) serve on the Review Panel for continuity.

Artist Review Panel One

- Reviews and scores ~20 artist applications shortlisted by Artist Qualification Panel based on the criteria provided.
- Identifies three (3) finalists who will be invited to develop site-specific conceptual proposals for the project.

Artist Orientation Meeting

- Artists Finalists will attend an Orientation Meeting arranged by Commission staff with representatives of the Client agency, Architect Design Team, and Community Representatives.
- All Review Panel members are invited to participate in the orientation meetings.
 Participation is voluntary.
- Orientation meetings involve a site visit and review of project background materials. The orientation meeting is typically 1-2 hours in duration.



Artist Orientation Meeting for Alameda Creek Watershed Project (2019)

- To ensure that artists propose feasible and durable artwork of the highest aesthetic quality, staff reviews the development of artwork proposals prior to any public display or submission to the Review Panel.
- Proposals are posted on the Arts Commission website for 2 weeks to allow for public comment. Proposal boards may also be placed on public view at an accessible public location near the project site.
- Public comment will be provided to the Review Panel for their consideration. Public comment is not a vote and is not intended as an accurate representation of the community's preference.



Artist Review Panel Two

- Artist Finalists present their proposals and are interviewed by the panel.
- SFAC Public Art Project Manager presents a summary of public comments received on the proposals and results of artist reference checks.
- After deliberation and scoring, one (1) artist finalist/proposal is selected for recommendation to the Arts Commission for each artwork opportunity.

Scoring Process + Criteria

Each panelist will provide numeric scores based on the following criteria:

- Artist Merit
- Relevant Skills + Experience
- Meets Project Goals
- Appropriate to the Project Site
- Feasibility and Maintainability

Artist/proposal with highest score will be recommended to the Arts Commission for approval.



Community Involvement

- SFAC public art project updates to project Community Events and Meetings (Ongoing)
- One community representatives will serve on the Division of Training Project Artist Review Panel and will participate in the Artist Orientation meetings.
- Finalists' proposals will be on display for public comment on the SFAC website and in a physical location in proximity to the site for two weeks prior to the final artist review panel meetings.
- All review panels, Visual Arts Committee (VAC) and Commission meetings are held virtually and are open to the public.


